

Bird Survey February 16th, 2026

Cedarville Ponds Wildlife Management Area

Cloudy, wet and 40°F. Did a maybe .2 mile loop around a fairly open, but still wooded area with mostly Oak, Pine and Beach trees. The snow has finally melted. However, it was still extremely cold and “miserable” today. It also just rained last night, so everything was very wet.

Walk- 15 Minutes

- American Robins, multiple.
- 2 Canadian Geese flying over, but as a whole they are still very prevalent in the area.
- A Red-Bellied Woodpecker.

Notes

Not many birds today, perhaps because of the rain. It also could be that the snow melting gave them the chance to spread their foraging out more. Lots of ducks are still in our tidal creeks and ponds around here, and I saw a Northern Flicker foraging in the lawn yesterday! A flock of at least 1,000 Snow Geese has also been wintering in the area, and is often found on the same farm field along Cedarville-Fairton Road.
